

Welcome to the Dedan Kimathi University Wildlife Conservancy (DeKUWC), your destination for exclusive wildlife experience. Covering 140 acres of indigenous forest, the conservancy offers a unique, secluded atmosphere for conferencing, wildlife viewing, and nature walks, bird watching, coffee tourism, educational tours, bush dinner and walking safaris, and is located just 6 km North of Nyeri town in Nyeri county.

Visitors to Dedan Kimathi University Wildlife Conservancy have the chance to see some of Kenya's most famous wildlife as well as some exotic species. DeKUWC is home to a variety of grazing mammals including wildebeest, warthogs, impalas, suni, Reedbucks, Burchell's Zebras, Defassa Waterbucks and Bushbucks.



We also host the Andean Llamas and a variety of indigenous, birds, reptiles and amphibians. Members of the ape family include the Black and White Columbus Monkeys and the Sykes Monkey.

Unique bird species are the quails, Hartlaub's Turaco, Black cap, Narina Trogon, various species of sunbirds and the threatened Hinde's Babbler amongst over 200 species of birds.
